## **United Way Hosts Annual Donation Drive for Tompkins County Pantries**

Ithaca, NY – September marks "Food Security Month," and United Way of Tompkins County (UWTC), Wegmans, and other dedicated community partners are teaming up for the annual Stephen E. Garner Week of Caring now through September 21st to ensure that the shelves of Tompkins County's food pantries remain fully stocked. Gregg Houck, UWTC's Senior Director of Community Impact shares that, "many local pantries have already exhausted their annual budgets due to rising food costs and significant levels of need as more residents have been pushed into poverty." According to a 2023 United for ALICE report, of Tompkins County's 44,469 households in 2021, 20% earned below the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and 21% were ALICE (asset-limited, income-constrained, employed) households that earned above the FPL but not enough to afford the basics in the communities where they live. Together, 41% of households in Tompkins County were below the ALICE Threshold (poverty + ALICE divided by total households).

As part of UWTC's commitment to food security in Tompkins County, Week of Caring is held to engage and organize the community to support impacted households by collecting food and other essential items. In addition to shelf-stable food, UWTC is encouraging the donation of baby care supplies, personal care and hygiene items, and laundry/cleaning products. On September 22<sup>nd</sup>, volunteers will gather at Cass Park from 8:30am – 11:30am to sort and equitably divide all the donations for distribution to area pantries and community cupboards. This will be followed by a public Campaign Kick-Off event at noon to launch UWTC's annual Community Campaign.

Donations will be accepted through Thursday, September 21<sup>st</sup>.
