This pilot program will provide life-skills preparation and intensive case management for youth still living with a parent or guardian, but who have identical risk profiles as homeless youth and those currently in foster care. Due to funding restrictions, the youth targeted by this pilot program are currently unable to access existing programs due to eligibility criteria.	\$5,000
